ENDOWED SUPPORT FOR BENTLEY LIBRARY GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS EACH YEAR

\$750,000 each

Graduate students in historical and archival fields have specific and tailored research needs, many of which can be met through the Library. A graduate fellowship would enable these researchers to focus solely on their work, and to formulate informed questions while drawing persuasive conclusions from archival information. Supporting the thrill of direct access to original sources and new discovery based on these sources will help foster the next generation of historical researchers.

ENDOWED SUPPORT FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS RESEARCHING AT THE BENTLEY LIBRARY

\$500,000 each

Undergraduate students love to work in the Bentley collections. The Bentley itself is a kind of laboratory for historical learning, about which students become passionate and engaged. But students need guidance and access to the kinds of training and careers that are possible for academic historians and archivists. Scholarships for undergraduates doing research with Bentley materials can provide an in-depth look at the both collections and the career possibilities therein. Ideally, the funds would provide a summer of research at a level that negated the need for a separate part-time job.
