### GAME NOTES

Tonight's game was the first night football game ever on the home field of the Fighting Irish. Notre Dame had played 20 previous night games, including four bowl contests. Musco Mobile Lighting, Inc., installed the system. It was the first time a college football game has ever been played utilizing a portable lighting system.

The Fighting Irish played their first football game ever against the Michigan Wolverines in 1887.

Notre Dame's record for s-ason openers now stands at 80-8-5

81=8=5 over all

and 60=7=3 at home.

Notre Dame's record vs Michigan is now 5 wins and 11 losses.

The last time that Michigan was held to less than 100 yards rushing in a football game was on November 10, 1974, when Purdue beat the Wolberines by a 24=21 score. Michigan was held to 41 yards rushing in tonight's game.

Larry Moriarty's 116 yfards rushing on 16 carries tonight was the first time a Notre Dame fullback rushed for 100 or more yards since Jerome Heavens rushed for 100 yards at Cleveland Stadium against Navy in 1978.

Mike Johnston had not attempted a field goal for Notre Dame before tonight's game in which he kicked field goals of 35, 37 and 41 ayrds.

When Larry Moriarty ran for 24 yards and a touchdown early in the second quarter of tonight's game, it marked the second straight year in which Moriarty scored the first TD of the season for the Irish.

Anthony Carter's 72 yard punt return in this game was the second punt return for & touchdown in his career. It was the first punt return for a TD against the Irish since the Purdue game of 1960.

Going into tonght's game, the Fighting Irish needed just 7 points to reach 20,000 points scored in the team's career. Their 23 points gives them a total of 20,016 points.

### QUOTES FROM COACH FAUST

It was a well played football game by both teams. It was a hard-hitting game. Michigan has an excellent football team.

I'm proud of our young men. Everything that could go wrong in a football game did. We came back from adversity.

We beat a great football team tonight. We're becoming a better football team

(ABOUT BLAIR KIEL) Blair has come into his own. Our offensive line did an excellent job of protecting him.

Our defense was excellent tonight even though the scoreboard might not have shown it.

I'm glad Anthony Carter is graduating. He is really something else.

We are stronger this year, but where still not where we ought to be.

The biggest thing I learned last year was to keep my head up, and that is what I told the kids.

I think we are a little bit more mature this year.

This is my best win at Notre Dame.

I'm happy for the kids, the players, the alumni, and all the fans.

### NOTRE DAME PLAYER QUOTES

TOM THAYER, GUARD -- (On handling Michigan's offensive line) We got confidence as the game went along. You never know you can handle them until the game begins. After the first drive, we realized that we could take them and our confidence built up from that.

This is the best win for me since I've been here, better than Alabama, the Michigan game two years ago, better than any of them. We're taking them one game at a time. On Monday we will think only about Purdue. Nothing is stopping us now.

DAVE DUERSON, SAFETY -- This was a very important win for us, for the coaching staff, the team and the student body.

The 17 points was no indication of the game that the defense played. Our defense was outstanding.

After Michigan scored two touchdowns late we still felt that we had them. We came back to the sidelines and felt that we could bend but not fold.

(About the interception): Coach Johnson (Jim) told me just to hang in the middle and wait for the crossing route -- it was a great call. I was going straight for the football. With the way things were going, what with the punt return and the freak touchdown, I knew we had to have the ball. You've got to go for the gusto.

Actually, the ball hit me first. We both got there at the same time and I had it craddled in my left arm and he was trying to strip it away from me.

MUNICIPAL MIKE JOHNSTON, KICKER: -- (On the first field goal) I was nervous, but that's natural. It felt good when I kicked it, and then I looked up and it felt great. You know it's a good kick before it goes through -- you could just tell by the way you make contact.

I was very nervous -- it's a long time waiting till 8 at night, but Harry Oliver was on the sidelines and he helped me relax. I learned a lot fromkicking behind him.

BLAIR KIEL, QUARTERBACK -- I can't say enough about our offensive line. I had all the time in the world. We have a real good relationship. They know what I can do and they take care of me.

I feel a lot better this year. The coaches believe in me, the players believe in me, and because of that, I believe in myself.

This year both myself and the offensive line decided to suck it up. We had something to prove and tonight we went out and did it.

The short passes are very much a part of our gameplan. That's coach Hudson right there. He's the instigator behind our offense.

Last yearagainst Michigan, we weren't as ready to play as we were tonight. Last year's embarrassement was pretty good incentive for us, we didn't want to be embarrassed like that again.

This is a different Notre Dame football team this year.

GREG BELL, TAILBACK -- (On his fumble) When I hit the ground the whistle blew and the referee said to unpile easy. I rolled over on my back and the ref just took the ball and gave it to Mi hhigan.

MARK ZAVAGNIN, MIDDLE LINEBACKER -- Thach Faust and the team took a lot of abuse becaus of last season. But we got our confidence back tonight. We believe in ourselves.

### MICHIGAN COACH BO SCHEMBECHLER:

I didn't recognize that team out there. The offensive line got whipped. They simply played terrible. The defensive line didn't tackle well. We just made too many mistakes.

We couldn't run the ball and we couldn't stop their backs. We had a chance to win the game. Two wild plays gave us the opportunity, but we really didn't deserve to be in the game at all.

(On Carter's punt return) It got us close but that's about it. Anthony had to sit out the rest of the game with a pulled muscle.

The (about Kiel) I always did think he was a pretty good quarterback. I really don't know if Notre Dame is that much better than last year, or if we're just that bad.

Notre Dame is stronger up front than Wisconsin. However there was nothing in their defensive lineup that should have caused any confusion for Steve Smith.

(on Moriarty) He really surprised me, but then again I hadn't really seen him. I don't know if he's a good back or if we're just that bad at tackling — and I'm not being facitious. Tonight's game was unrecognizable to me. I just can't believe we got whipped.

(on drive stalled by delay of game) That delay really hurt us. Smith was checking off at the right time because we knew they were coming. It would have been a hell of a thing if we could have scored. It would have been the damndest fixed Finish I've ever seen."

### MICHIGAN PLAYER QUOTES

LARRY SWEENEY, CENTER -- We just didn't play as well as we could have. There wasn't one thing that went wrong, but a number of things added up and after a while we just couldn't control it. It's a shame really because we're so much better than what we showed tonight. But give Notre Dame credit, there a really good team and a bunch of classy guys.

JOHN LOTT, DEFENSIVE BACK -- We were a little flat and we weren't mentally ready when we came out on the field. The coaches had the right game plan, but we just couldn't put it together. It seems that once they started to roll, they just kept going and we couldn't stop them. We didn't deserve to win tongiht and that's about all you can say. We'll bounce back, our season isn't over.

ANTHONY CARTER, WIDE RECEIVERE-- Things went wrong from the start. I pulled my groin and I don't know when I'm going to be back.
