## POST-GAME COACHES QUOTES

### ***Iowa Head Coach Hayden Fry:***

On Michigan:

"That's a great football team across the way. They are a collection of some of the finest athletes that you will ever see on a football field."

On Iowa's defense:

"I feel really good about our defense, we finally gelled today. We tackled very well against a team that has probably the best running back in the country (Tyrone Wheatley). I saw a lot of improvement on defense in areas that we weren't very good at against Penn State."

On Iowa's offense:

"Despite the fact that we only scored 7 points, I really believe our offense improved a lot also. We realistically should have had 17 points, maybe more. That is encouraging because at Penn State we weren't even close to scoring."

On quarterback Paul Burmeister:

"I thought (Paul) Burmeister did extremely well. He only made two mistakes all day, and was throwing the ball very well all the way to the end."

On the game in general:

"I'm mad and disappointed that we lost the game, but I'm very proud of my football team. We had chances to score some points and win the game, but in all honesty, we just weren't good enough."

### ***Michigan Head Coach Gary Moeller:***

On the game in general:

"I'm happy with fact we won, it was a big plus. The defense improved, but they still need work. I thought we had better numbers (of players) getting to the ball."

On the Michigan offense:

"On offense we self-destructed ... we had three opportunities (kick-off return, fumble recovery ...) and we came away with just three points. Give them (Iowa) credit, they played hard."

On the team after four games:

"Are we bad? No, but we want to be as good as we can be."

On keeping Iowa from scoring on the last play of the game:

"It was a big stop at the end. It gives us momentum and gets some young kids some confidence."

On winning against Iowa (as opposed to non-conference foes Houston or Washington State):

"You feel very good when you beat Iowa. Iowa can play football."

On having Tyrone Wheatley available:

"It means a lot. He's something special ... When Collins pops a five-yard pass over the middle, and then he scores ... This game today was him (Wheatley), Iowa took away some of our passing game."

On the play of Buster Stanley:

"Buster Stanley played a great game. He has been playing well every single game."

### ***Buster Stanley:***

"This was my best game of the season. Last week was not our defense. We decided to have a meeting last Sunday, and we discussed playing Michigan football. You can't miss 17 tackles like last week and expect to win. We had a different attitude to win. We had a different attitude in practice and coming into the Big Ten, we had a different attitude."

"As a leader, I knew we were not playing Michigan Defense against Houston. All the seniors got together last Sunday and we decided we had to play like Michigan."

"We made mistakes today, but today we didn't let that bother us like last week. We were hitting better, we had a better attitude, and we turned it around, practice, everything."

"I'm an intense player, but I don't talk it on the field, I don't talk it in the lockerroom, I just play it on the field. Iowa ran the basic offense. They did try some run-out passes, but basically they showed us the same offense as on film from last week."

### ***Todd Collins:***

"Even though we didn't win by a big margin today, it was a big win for the team. It was also the first Big Ten win for me. I didn't lose patience, and we didn't have turnovers or interceptions. We had good protection and we completed more this week. We are well-focused. Our national championship hopes are gone, but we have a Big Ten season and that's what we're striving for."

POST-GAME NOTES

**CALL HIM "MR. SIX"**

For the second straight game, **Tyrone Wheatley** scored three touchdowns (five-yard rush, 48-yard reception, and three-yard rush). **Wheatley's** three touchdowns moved him into third place on Michigan's career total touchdown list with 35 career total touchdowns (30 rushing, four receiving, and one kickoff return). **Wheatley** trails Heisman Trophy winner **Desmond Howard** (37 career touchdowns in 1989-91) and **Anthony Carter** (40 career touchdowns in 1979-82) on Michigan's career total touchdowns list. **Wheatley's** two rushing touchdowns tied him with another Heisman Trophy winner, **Tom Harmon**, for fourth place on Michigan's career rushing touchdown list with 30 career rushing touchdowns. **Wheatley** needs one more rushing touchdown to tie **Steve Smith** and **Billy Taylor** for second place in career rushing touchdowns and is just four rushing touchdowns shy of **Rick Leach's** Michigan career rushing touchdown record of 34 set in 1975-78. Today's three touchdown performance is the fourth of **Wheatley's** career and the third three-TD performance in his last five games—the others coming last week against Houston and in last season's 52-28 win over Iowa and 38-31 Rose Bowl victory over Washington. **Wheatley** has now scored a touchdown in each game this season (three rushing against Houston, two rushing against Notre Dame and one rushing touchdown against Washington State). **Wheatley** is on pace to score 25 rushing touchdowns this season which would break the Michigan single season rushing touchdown record of 19 set by **Ron Johnson** in 1968.

**HURTING THE HAWKEYES**

For the fourth time in four games this season, **Tyrone Wheatley** rushed for over 100 yards. **Wheatley** carried the ball 28 times for 113 yards (4.0 avg) and two touchdowns against Iowa. In the past two seasons, **Wheatley** has had big performances against the Hawkeyes, totaling 337 rushing yards (224 in 1992 and 113 today), 425 all-purpose yards (223 in 1992 and 202 today), and six touchdowns (three in each game). **Wheatley's** 113 rushing yards give him 547 yards on 94 carries (5.8 yards per carry, 136.8 rushing yards per game) and eight rushing TDs this season. **Wheatley** now has 2452 career rushing yards (ninth most in school history) on 365 carries (6.7 avg.-best in school history) and 30 rushing TDs. **Wheatley** has rushed for 100+ yards 12 times in his career (the sixth most 100+ yard rushing games by a Wolverine), six times in the last six games, and 11 times in his last 13 games. Michigan is 10-1-1 in games in which **Wheatley** rushes for 100 or more yards and is 10-1 in games in which he rushes for over 100 yards

**ALL-PURPOSE ACHIEVER**

**Tyrone Wheatley**, the nation's leading all-purpose back coming into today's game, turned in another strong all-purpose performance, collecting 202 all-purpose yards (113 rushing, 60 receiving, and 29 on kickoff returns) and three touchdowns. **Wheatley** now has 3440 career all-purpose yards, the seventh highest total in school history. **Wheatley's** 60 receiving yards represent the highest single-game receiving total of his career. For the season, **Wheatley** now has 876 all-purpose yards for an average of 219 all-purpose yards per game.

**STANDOUT STANLEY**

**Buster Stanley** had one of the finest days of his career against Iowa. **Stanley** collected 10 tackles (seven solo, three assists) with three tackles for losses totaling 19 yards, including two sacks for 18 yards. **Stanley** now has 10 career sacks for 65 lost yards, both 10th most in school history. **Stanley**, ESPN's Michigan player of the game, also caused a fumble and had a fumble recovery to help the Michigan defense limit the Hawkeyes to seven points, the lowest offensive output by a Michigan opponent since last season's 40-7 win over Northwestern. **Jarret Irons** also keyed the Wolverine defense, leading the team with a career-high 14 tackles (12 solo, two assists).

**POWERS HAS SEASON-BEST GAME**

Co-captain **Ricky Powers** had his best game of the season, rushing seven times for 50 yards (7.1 avg.) against Iowa. **Powers'** rushing total is his highest since he ran for 71 yards against the Hawkeyes last season. **Powers'** 50 rushing yards moved him into 11th place on Michigan's career rushing yardage list with 2577 career rushing yards.

**THE RETURN OF ALEXANDER THE GREAT**

**Derrick Alexander** saw his first game action since injuring his ankle against Washington State in the season opener. **Alexander** returned with a strong performance, collecting four passes for 72 yards (18.0 avg.). **Alexander's** performance moved him into eighth place on Michigan's career receiving list with 1469 yards and seventh place on the career receiving list with 96. **Alexander** is 31 receiving yards shy of becoming the eighth player in Michigan history to accumulate 1500 career receiving yards and is four receptions from becoming the sixth Michigan receiver to catch 100 passes in a career.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

The Michigan special teams came up with several big plays against the Hawkeyes. **Walter Smith** caused a fumble on a kickoff which led to **Steve King's** first career fumble recovery. **Jason Horn** blocked a Hawkeye field goal attempt and **Gannon Dudlar** picked up the loose ball for a six-yard gain. The last time Michigan blocked a field goal was **Jean-Agnus Charles'** block against Ohio State last season.
