Effective August 1971

(Subject to change at any time  
by the Regents of the University)

## FEE REGULATIONS

1. The Board of Regents shall determine the level of full program student fees and a schedule of such fees shall be published. All other student fees shall be fixed by the Committee on Budget Administration.
2. All fees are payable in accordance with the regulations established by the Vice-President and Chief Financial Officer providing only that said regulations may not defer payment of these fees beyond the end of the term for which they are assessed.
3. No exemption from the payment of fees shall be granted unless specifically approved in advance by the Board.

#### C. Camps and Stations

The schedule of fees for the divided term shall be applicable in general to the Biological Station, Camp Davis, Camp Filibert Roth, the Fresh Air Camp, Geology Expeditions, the Speech Improvement Camp, and the University Division of the National Music Camp. Fees and charges for living accommodations, meals and other student services shall be established and adjusted from time to time on recommendation of the director or the appropriate dean.

### III. ENGLISH LANGUAGE INSTITUTE

English Language Institute fees must be paid in advance, and no student may enter upon his work until after such payment.

### V. APPLICATION FEES

A nonrefundable fee of \$15 will be required of each applicant for admission to any unit of the University.

### VI. ENROLLMENT DEPOSIT

The enrollment deposit is a \$50 payment to guarantee an enrollment space. All new students are required to establish this deposit. Included in the category of new

students are former students who were not enrolled in the University the previous two terms. "Summer only" and guest students are not required to establish this deposit.

The enrollment deposit is applied toward the payment of student fees for the term in which the student has been admitted. Failure to enroll for this term will result in forfeiture of the enrollment deposit.

PAYMENT of this deposit is requested within three weeks after receipt of an Enrollment Deposit Request Form. The deposit must be submitted to the Cashier's office by:

May 1	For fall admission
December 1	For winter admission
April 1	For spring admission
June 1	For summer admission

Students receiving the Enrollment Deposit Request Form less than three weeks prior to the above dates must establish their deposit within three weeks from the date the request is received.

### **VII. LATE REGISTRATION FEE**

A late registration fee of \$15 will be assessed students who register after the end of the scheduled registration period for any term or program.

### **VIII. LABORATORY AND OTHER SUPPLEMENTAL FEES, CHARGES, AND DEPOSITS**

1. *Laboratory and Other Supplementary Fees and Charges, Including Deposits.* Fees and charges calculated to cover the costs of materials and supplies consumed, breakage and other losses, are established by the Committee on Budget Administration on recommendation by the appropriate dean or director.

2. *Diplomas, Student Receipts, etc.* Charges reasonably calculated to defray the cost of issuing duplicate diplomas, certificates, student receipts, student identification cards, student transcripts, etc., are established by the Committee on Budget Administration.

3. *Short Courses, Conferences, and Institutes.* Fees reasonably calculated to cover instructional and other related costs and charges incurred in the offering of short courses, conferences, and institutes, are established by the Committee on Budget Administration on recommendation by the appropriate dean or director.

### **IX. ADJUSTMENT IN FEES**

A student who changes his program in the first two weeks of classes will receive a full refund of the fees paid and will be assessed the full fee appropriate to the new elections. If changes are made thereafter, the higher of the two fees will be assessed.

### **X. REFUND OF FEES**

1. Students withdrawing after registration and before the end of the first two weeks of classes shall pay a disenrollment fee of \$50 but will be refunded any part of the fee which has been paid.

2. Students withdrawing during the third week of classes in the divided term and in the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth week of classes in the full term shall pay a disenrollment fee of \$50 or shall forfeit 50 per cent of the assessed fee, whichever is larger.

3. Students withdrawing subsequent to the third week of classes in the divided term and to the sixth week of classes in the full term shall pay the assessed term fee in full.
4. The effective date of refund is the date the withdrawal notice is received in the Registrar's Office.
5. Any refund due the student will be mailed to his address of record.

### **RESIDENCE REGULATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN**

1. No one is deemed a resident for the purpose of registration in the University unless he or she, being twenty-one years of age or older, has resided in this state six months next preceding the date of proposed enrollment (see items 3 and 4 below for status of minors).
2. No person is deemed to have gained or lost residence while a student at any institution of learning except by changes in status effected under item 3 below, and except that enrollment in a Michigan institution for 3 semester hours or less during the required six-months' period shall not preclude the establishment of resident status.
3. The residence of students who are minors follows that of the parents or of the legal guardians. If the family of a University of Michigan student who is a minor moves out of Michigan, the student's residency is maintained so long as he is continuously enrolled. Interruptions for the summer term will not affect the residence status of the student.
4. Minor students who come to the University from other states or countries cannot register as residents on the basis of having a resident of Michigan as guardian except on permission of the Vice-President responsible for the Office of the Registrar in each individual case. Such permission will not be granted where there is evidence that the guardianship was established primarily for the purpose of gaining residence for the minor.
5. Classification as a resident is neither achieved by reason of marriage to a resident nor lost by reason of marriage to a nonresident.
6. An alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States, who has otherwise met these requirements for residence, is regarded eligible for registration as a resident.
7. Full-time members of the "teaching staff," Teaching Fellows at the University of Michigan whose appointments require at least three contact hours of teaching each week in regularly assigned formal classes, and their dependents, may register in the University as residents. Teaching Fellows who complete two full terms of service during a calendar year may register as residents for the third term also.
8. Changes in status from nonresident to resident shall take effect in the term during which the appeal for such change is filed.
9. Discretion to adjust individual cases within the spirit of these regulations is lodged with the Vice-President responsible for the Office of the Registrar.
